Report on the 2008 ICOM-Glass Committee Meeting Nancy, 27-31 October

Dear ICOM Glass Members,

I am delighted to tell you about the last ICOM Glass Meeting organised in Nancy. It was a really interesting meeting that allowed us to extend our knowledge of the Art Nouveau and Art Déco glasses of *l'École de Nancy*. The program of lectures, as well as the variety of visits organized to museums, institutions, private collections, schools and glass factories of the city of Nancy and the region of Lorraine, allowed us to examine closely the glass activities of this area of the North-East of France.

We had the good fortune to have the organization of the meeting in the hands of a group of really capable people, including Valerie Thomas and Emmanuelle Guiotat (Nancy, École Museum), Veronique Brumm (Lalique Museum), and Michaela Lerch (Baccarat). Thanks to all of them, the meeting was a real success and unforgettable for all of us.
